





Marking the 10 year anniversary of Ireland's Marriage Equality Referendum in 2025, Rena's photography and film exhibition celebrates this important milestone in LGBTQI history by creating a new body of work called **The Rings of Kerry**.

Rena and her partner were very active in the campaign and were the first gay couple to get married in Kerry. They made a film about the whole process at the time which will be featured in this exhibition. Having always played an active part in whichever community Rena finds herself, this mind-set has inspired this project. She will document a community that is dear to her heart and growing in size and vibrancy over the past number of years.

It will feature LGBTQI couples who have gotten married over the last ten years in Kerry and document how the referendum has impacted their lives. Ireland was the only country in the world to vote for gay marriage. As of 2025, marriage between same-sex couples is legally performed and recognised in only 37 countries - Ireland plays an important role in sending light and hope around the world.

Tonnta Tire means Ground waves. The concept of the work is to explore and encourage connection with place via the colour and music of that place. The wealth of local traditional music is central to the work. In collaboration with Peter Mullarkey of the Binneas archive of traditional music.

With a micro funding grant from Creative Places Iveragh, Helen has devised a colour notation system from the colour palette found in the home place of a 'pilot' tune from the collection. This enabled her to paint a tune which can be apprehended instantaneously. The circular gallery space at Siamsa Tire enables the creation of a work which challenges notions of time and experience as the work can be read in cyclical and linear time.

The exhibition also includes work that investigates other aspects of the pilot tune e.g. grace notes chords, linearity etc in differing visual formats.

Artist talks or workshops on the topics of visualising sound through Chladni plates (with a little bit of light science), the creative process of devising the project, or connection to place in an unstable world, connection to new places, destroyed places etc will be announced soon.
