

Production Team

Director - Oliver Hurley

Oliver Hurley began his career as a performer with Siamsa Tíre, The National Folk Theatre of Ireland – and later served as Artistic Director from 2000 to 2005, directing productions such as Samhain, Oisín, and Oileán. He has toured extensively across Ireland, the UK, Europe, North America, and Australia.



In 2005, he founded The Oliver Hurley School of Musical Theatre, training students from across Kerry in drama,

singing, and dance. Oliver has received seventeen AIMS nominations, winning "Best Director" four times and "Best Choreographer" for Hot Mikado.

He also has a strong background in event management, having led the operations of the Rose of Tralee International Festival for 15 years, and continues to manage key events in Tralee. He is delighted to be working once again with the talented cast from across Kerry in this year's Summer Musical at Siamsa Tíre.

Musical Director - Sorcha O'Connor

Sorcha hails from Currow, Co Kerry. In 2018, Sorcha graduated from MTU Cork School of Music, having specialised in vocal study with Rob Craig and choral conducting. Sorcha is a vocal coach and piano teacher with Killarney School of Music, teaches singing with the Oliver Hurley Stage School and is a tutor with Music Generation Kerry. Sorcha balances her busy teaching career with an assortment of choral work throughout Kerry, and has recently been appointed Choral Director



for Killarney's newest choir 'Stronger Together Choir'. Sorcha has been working with Killarney Musical Society since 2020, for their last four productions, and was the choral director for Tralee Musical Society's 2024 production of *Sister Act*, and Siamsa Tire's first summer musical *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* in 2024. She is also the choral director with Killorglin Pantomime Group for the past three years.



Choreographer - Justin Walsh

Justin Walsh began his Theatre and Dance career aged seven with Siamsa Tire, training in theatre and dance, and becoming a full-time professional member at 18. He toured nationally and internationally and represented Ireland at Expo 92. From age 20 Justin pursued a career in dance in the College of Dance Dublin, obtaining a diploma in professional Dance Training. In 2003 Justin began an eight -year touring career worldwide, performing in Michael Flatley's productions of 'Celtic Tiger', 'Feet of Flames',

'Emerald Beat The Show' and joined 'Riverdance The Show' in 2008 where he finished out his touring career.

In 2020 Justin completed a Master's Degree in Dance Performance at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance University College Limerick. Justin is currently the Community Engagement Manager at Siamsa Tire, teaches dance for The Oliver Hurley School of Musical Theatre, is choreographer for Tralee Musical Society and guest tutor in University College Limerick.



Lighting & Projection Designer - John Hurley

John's love of musical theatre began when he joined Tralee Musical Society to help build sets and special effects. He worked on many musicals including *Joseph*, *West Side Story*, *42nd Street*, *Hot Mikado*, *Me and My Girl* and numerous variety shows. His talents for all things technical were spotted by Siamsa Tire and John spent a number of years working part time as a lighting and sound operator in Siamsa. This led to him to design lighting for numerous shows, plays and concerts in the venue, John

went freelance in 1998 when he designed his first big musical by Killarney Musical Society, *Me and My Girl*. John has designed for many of their award-winning shows since. 13 years ago, John returned to his roots with Tralee Musical Society for their production of Titanic and he has continued to design for all their shows since. John has also designed for many Pantos, stage school and variety shows and for regional Musical Societies. John's work has been recognised with numerous nominations and wins in the annual AIMS Awards ceremony in the Best Technical Category.

* Making her *pawsome* debut on the Siamsa Tire stage, Lola Kelly steps into the spotlight as the feisty and fearless Toto in *The Wizard of Oz.* A seasoned vocalist and fluffy blanket thief, Lola brings boundless energy and tail-wagging charisma to her very first musical—with only minimal bribery with chicken.

Originally discovered napping dramatically on a velvet cushion, Lola trained in the noble art of Treat Fetching and early wake up calls for her humans. Her inspirations include Lassie, Snoopy, Sandy and that one confident pug she met in the park. Critics (aka her humans) describe her as a natural scene-stealer and impressively unmoved by the vacuum cleaner.

Lola promises audiences a performance full of heart, fluff, and the occasional imprompturoll on the stage—because when it comes to Oz, there's truly no place like home!

Glinda the Good Witch - Róisín Sugrue

Róisín is eighteen years old and has been involved in shows for over fourteen years, ever since she started at Oliver Hurley stage school. She is also a member of Tralee Musical Society, where she has had the amazing opportunity to perform in many shows over the years. She's played roles such as Jasmine in *Aladdin* and Belle in *Beauty and the Beast* in the Christmas panto, and Elizabeth Proctor in her school's production of *The Crucible*.

She has also been doing ballet since the age of three under Colette Jensen. Recently, she completed her grade 6 singing exam under Noelle Barrett. Róisín can't wait to sprinkle some Glinda magic on the siamsa stage this summer!

The Wizard of OZ

ACT 1 Dorothy Gale, a young girl living on a Kansas farm with Aunt Em and Uncle Henry, dreams of escaping her dull life "somewhere over the rainbow."

When her dog, *Toto*, is threatened by the mean Miss Gulch, Dorothy runs away from home but encounters Professor Marvel, who convinces her to return.

A sudden cyclone hits, sweeping Dorothy away in her house to the magical land of Oz. She arrives in Munchkinland, where she is greeted by *Glinda the Good Witch* and learns she has accidentally killed the Wicked Witch of the East. The *Munchkins* celebrate her as a heroine, but the *Wicked Witch of the West*, the dead witch's sister, arrives to seek revenge.

Glinda gives Dorothy the enchanted **Ruby Slippers** and tells her the only way home is to seek help from the mysterious Wizard of Oz in the Emerald City. Dorothy sets off on the Yellow Brick Road, and along the way she befriends: the Scarecrow, who wants a brain, the Tin Man, who desires a heart, and the Cowardly Lion, who seeks courage.

They all journey together, hoping the Wizard will grant their wishes.

After a perilous trek — including a dangerous poppy field that nearly puts them to sleep — they arrive in Emerald City and are granted an audience with the *Wizard*. He agrees to help them only if they bring him the broomstick of the *Wicked Witch of the West*.

Act 2 The group sets off to find the *Witch*. In the Haunted Forest, the Witch sends flying monkeys and enchanted creatures to stop them. *Dorothy* is

captured and taken to the Witch's castle. While imprisoned, she learns the Witch wants her ruby slippers. *The Scarecrow, Tin Man, and Lion* launch a rescue, and during the escape, Dorothy throws water on the *Witch*, melting her.

They return to the Emerald City with the broomstick. However, when they confront the Wizard again, they discover he's just an ordinary man — a fraud hiding behind a curtain. Despite this, he helps the *Scarecrow*, *Tin Man*, *and Lion* realise that they already possess the qualities they were seeking.

The Wizard prepares to take Dorothy back to Kansas in a hot air balloon, but she misses the departure. Glinda reappears and tells Dorothy she has always had the power to return home—by clicking her heels together and repeating: "There's no place like home."

Tin Man - David Lynch
