Liam's play Jilly Morgan's Birthday Party debuted at Belltable in May 2024 and is currently enjoying a national tour. His play He Dies in the End is upcoming at Dublin Fringe. His play for children Boss Rob: A Masterclass for Aspiring Artists (IMMA and Irish Tour) was a Dublin City Council Creative Hubs commission. His play Mam and Love and Woo received the Wilde Irish Writer Award and is currently in development, as is his new play The Caterpillar Cake.

Liam has been artist in residence at Belltable, Centre Cultural Irlandais, Paris and at Mary Immaculate College, Limerick. This year he was shortlisted for the Phelim Donlon Bursary from the Irish Theatre Institute, the Prague Fringe Inspiration Award and received a special Judge's Award for Innovation in Children's Theatre from Dublin Fringe. He has participated in Druid Theatre's Fuel programme, Corcadorca's Show festival, Branar's Meitheal, Axis Assemble, and Words Words Words at the Traverse Theatre, Edinburgh. He studied drama at Trinity College, Dublin and at UC Berkeley.



Jack


